Vulnerable Adult Mandated Reporting

Course Description

This introduction to the mandated reporting of the suspected maltreatment of vulnerable adults includes valuable information regarding statutory definitions for vulnerable adults, maltreatment and mandated reporters; how to determine what constitutes neglect, abuse or maltreatment; and procedures involved in reporting suspected maltreatment, to the Minnesota Adult Abuse Reporting Center (MAARC) the designated common entry point (CEP) for the public and mandated reporters.

Case studies are included throughout the course to help learners make the connection from statutory language to real-life situations. Completion time is approximately one hour depending on the learner's knowledge of the content.

Target Audience

Mandated reporters, such as county workers, care providers, law enforcement and health care professionals.

1. Understand the Vulnerable Adult Act.
 2. Know who is a mandated reporter.
 3. Define what constitutes maltreatment.
