



Minnesota Rulemaking Steps for Rule Adopted With a Hearing



Summary of Rule Requirements

Scope – M.S. 245.8251

Subdivision 1. Rules governing the use of positive support strategies and restrictive interventions

The commissioner of human services shall, by August 31, 2015, adopt rules to govern the use of positive support strategies, ensure the applicability of chapter 245D prohibitions and limits on emergency use of manual restraint and on the use of restrictive interventions to facilities and services governed by the rules. The rules apply to all facilities and services licensed under chapter 245D, and all licensed facilities and licensed services serving persons with a developmental disability or related condition. For the purposes of this section, "developmental disability or related condition" has the meaning given in [Minnesota Rules, part 9525.0016](#), subpart 2, items A to E.

9544.0000 Purpose

Chapter 9544 establishes methods, procedures and standards to be used by providers governed by this chapter for the use of positive support strategies with persons receiving services. The purpose of these rules is to improve the quality of life of persons receiving home and community based services or other licensed services by:

9544.0000 Purpose (II)

- A. promoting community participation, person-centeredness, and an approach that focuses on supporting persons receiving services in the most integrated setting;
- B. focusing on creating quality environments and lifestyles as primary responsibilities of license holders; ensuring collaborative, team-based development of positive support strategies;
- C. providing training to the person who receives services to improve the person's skills and facilitate the person's ability to meet self-identified goals;

9544.0000 Purpose (III)

- D. increasing the person's self-determination abilities so the person may engage in community activity to the greatest degree reasonably attainable;
- E. developing specific support programs that promote outcomes valued by the person, the person's family and the community to help the person receiving services improve the person's quality of life;
- F. ensuring people are free from humiliating and demeaning procedures;

9544.0000 Purpose (IV)

- G. eliminating all uses of aversive or deprivation procedures;
- H. creating a consistent set of standards for license holders to respond to behavior when serving people across licensed services and settings; and
- I. building staff knowledge and competence throughout a license holder's organization about the development and implementation of positive behavioral supports, person-centered planning, and community integration.

Behavior Intervention Report Form

Subp. 3. **Behavior intervention report form.**

“Behavior intervention report form” means the form prescribed by the commissioner to collect data in accordance with the requirements in Minnesota Statutes 245.8251, subdivision 2.

Emergency use of manual restraint

Subd. 8a. Emergency use of manual restraint.

"Emergency use of manual restraint" means using a manual restraint when a person poses an imminent risk of physical harm to self or others and is the least restrictive intervention that would achieve safety. Property damage, verbal aggression, or a person's refusal to receive or participate in treatment or programming on their own do not constitute an emergency.

Positive Support Strategy

Subp. 34. **Positive support strategy.** “Positive support strategy” means a strengths-based strategy based on an individualized assessment that emphasizes teaching a person productive and self-determined skills or alternative strategies and behaviors without the use of restrictive interventions.

Punishment

Subp. 38. **Punishment.** “Punishment” means the use of a procedure to reduce or stop a target behavior. Items A and B describe two types of punishment.

A. Type I punishment means decreasing the rate or future likelihood of a target behavior by applying an aversive stimulus or event. Type I punishment includes overcorrection techniques.

B. Type II punishment means decreasing the rate or future likelihood of a target behavior by removing a positive reinforcer.

Qualified Professional

- Defined separately for each service

Quality of Life Indicator

Subp. 40. **Quality of life indicator.** “Quality of life indicator” means a reportable or observable outcome that is measurable and important to the person. Quality of life indicators are used to assess beneficial changes desired by the person that enrich the person’s life experiences.
