

All interpreters are invited to explore ways to present educational concepts in a rich and meaningful way without just touching on the English words tied to the concept. Participants will explore ways to present educational *concepts in a rich and meaningful way using space and classifiers*. Specific examples include the state of MN, a world map, Time lines, US history (Civil War, birth of George Washington, Lewis and Clark), Mathematics (different kinds of bar graphs, algebra, number lines, and Classifiers for science including anatomy, plant structures, planets and biology.)

Educational Objectives:

- Participants will use space when interpreting historical events
- Participants will use classifiers when describing physical anatomy and biological structure concepts
- Participants will use space appropriately when interpreting mathematical equations.

Your Presenter: Albert is a part time ASL Instructor with the Department of Educational Psychology, College of Education and Human Development with the University of Minnesota-Minneapolis. He also teaches American Sign Language in the World Language Department at Eden Prairie High School. He gives countless workshops to the interpreters around the mid-western states.
