### Summit Purpose

Provide venues for a call to action bringing state, tribal and local leaders together in the spirit of collaboration to develop recommendations for a state wide awareness and response to prenatal substance use & infant exposure.

### About the Summit

The 2015 Minnesota Summit on Prenatal Substance Use and Infant Exposure aims to create a common understanding of substance use prevention, substance use disorder in women and the effects of substances on infants. The Summit will also serve as a springboard for building community partnerships around the concepts of a recovery oriented systems of care (ROSC) framework and a recovery continuum beginning with prevention through long-term recovery and resilience.

The Summit is designed to be the impetus toward developing and sustaining community collaboration. Participants are strongly encouraged to attend as a multi-faceted community team in order to gain the most from the experience. Such teams may include:
