

# Covering Minnesota in innovation.

The **Minnesota Accountable Health Model** is a framework for testing new ways of delivering and paying for health care, thanks to a \$45 million State Innovation Model (SIM) cooperative agreement, awarded to the Minnesota Departments of Health and Human Services in 2013 by The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation (CMMI).

## HIT/HIE \$9 million
